### MINI-CONCERTS by

- Brian Miller** (4:00-4:30, Retreat Center): From the Irish in America to the woodsmen of the north woods, Brian brings songs of work and everyday life.
- Dan Schatz** (3:30-4:00, Retreat Center): A multi-instrumentalist, Dan presents traditional songs as well as his own compositions.
- Elly Wininger** (3:00-3:30, Ehlers Memorial Hall): A newcomer to the Getaway, Elly is a fine guitarist whose repertoire features, first of all, blues, but includes lots of other styles and genres as well.
- Ernie Johnson & Skip Casale** (2:30-3:00, Nature Center): "Greenwich 1962: A Taste of the Village" will simulate a Bleeker Street coffeehouse experience, with songs from Fred Neil, Bob Dylan, Holy Modal Rounders and others.
